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
2. TASK 1 – 2 PIE CHARTS AND 1 BAR CHART




THE TASK

The charts below show one government's spending on culture and education in 2000 and 2010, and the number of people participating in these events in the same years.

Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features, and make comparisons where relevant.







ADVICE

- 1. You do not and should not try to describe everything. You have to select only the important features to report.
- 2. Show a variety of verb tenses, including past perfect in this text.

EXAMPLES

a. In 2000, music accounted for almost half of the arts spending. By 2010, this had changed to theatre receiving more money than the others, while music dropped to about one third of the arts budget.

- b. In 2000, just under a quarter of the arts budget was given to visual arts and literature received roughly a tenth. Ten years later, the money allocated to visual arts had dropped while literature was receiving about the same.
- 3. Use a variety of word forms.

<u>EXAMPLES</u>	
grew moderately OR _	experienced moderate growth
declined sharply OR _	had a sharp decline


3. TASK 1 – A LINE GRAPH ABOUT WINTER HEATING COSTS

ADVICE

- 1. The first paragraph is NOT an introduction it is an OVERVIEW. So just try to tell your reader (the examiner) the purpose of the chart/graph and what it shows. One strategy is to ask yourself some questions so that you don't forget anything.
 - Who is the graph about? older people
 - What does the graph say? cost of heating
 - What are the units of measurement? \$
 - How much change is there? green line large increase, the other lines hardly any change
 - How many different types are there? 3 gas, oil and electricity
 - When is the information from? 2003-2011
 - Where is the information? DON'T KNOW

2. Vary your verb tenses with the right time expressions. You will see how the student does this perfectly in the video.






THE TASK


The maps show changes in the extent of the Roman Empire over several centuries.


5. TASK 1 - 3 PIE CHARTS

- 1. IELTS requires you to SELECT and REPORT so you have to CHOOSE carefully what to report. And you have to CHOOSE carefully what to ignore and not include in your report. This video will give you a strategy to help you do this.
- 2. You will learn how to describe proportion.

EXAMPLES

- a. takes up the majority of
- b. account for the greatest proportion of
- c. the third most important
- d. the smallest expenditure item

- 3. And remember, in all IELTS Task 1 texts you must compare and contrast using words like
 - While
 - whereas
 - However,
 - In contrast,
 - similar



THE TASK


The graphs below give information about obesity in five regions, and food energy input and output in 2 of the regions over 10 years.

ADVICE

- 1. There is a lot of information to report so only choose what is significant and relevant to the purpose of the graph. What is the purpose?
 - to show the level of obesity around the world and how the food intake relates to the energy out

So focus on this when you write.

2. In this video you will also learn how to use and vary comparatives and superlatives.

EXAMPLES

- a. the highest amount of overweight people
- b. slightly lower
- c. not far behind
- d. the least number of overweight people
- e. the same level of intake

And other ways to compare ...

- a. compare (as a verb)
- b. provide a comparison of (as a noun)
- c. In contrast, (a sentence adverb)
- 3. And think about the variety of expression and vocabulary this data deals with food and obesity, so how many words and phrases do you know for this topic? Watch to find out.
- 4. You will learn how to combine adverbs and verbs.
- 5. And I will show you how to write with logical structure (how to make sense from paragraph to paragraph).



EXAMPLES

- b. is stored
- c. are made
- d. to be delivered
- e. can be heated
- f. are cooled
- g. are sent
- h. ... and so on

2. And you need a variety of ways to sequence/order the different steps or stages in the process.

EXAMPLES

- a. after + SUBJECT + present perfect passive, SUBJECT
- b. At this point,
- c. Once it is + -ed/adj., SUBJECT
- d. Once sth has been + -ed, it is then


9. TASK 1 – DESCRIBING A PROCESS ABOUT PAPER RECYCLING



ADVICE

- 1. Writing the overview is simple ask WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THE DATA?
 - IN THE LINE GRAPH?
 - IN THE TABLE?
- 2. then think about the WH- questions
 - who? where? when? and so on
- 3. Learn how to describe change over time.

EXAMPLES

- a. 4 times higher in 2005
- b. they still occupied the top spot 30 years later, reaching 30 million
- 4. And among other skills, learn how to have a good balance between main features and detail.

ADVICE

- 1. How to write an overview use questions like:
 - Where does the data come from? a town called Bronsonville
 - When was the data collected? in this example, over a 24 hour period
 - How many different items does the data deal with? in this example, 3 + the total
 - How are the data measured? in this example, in millions

Then use your answers to write a short paragraph of one or two sentences.

2. How to structure your text into 3 paragraphs – after the overview, separate the main features from the detail.

Now watch the video. Line graphs are quite common in the test. Good luck! Ruth $\stackrel{\circ}{\cup}$
